September 12, 2023

The Mower County Board of Commissioners in and for the County of Mower, Minnesota, met in Regular Session September 12, 2023 at 9:00 a.m. at the Government Center in Austin, Minnesota.

County Assessor Michael Harvey provided the Board with a department update. Mr. Harvey reported that with this year's quintile work the appraisers have physically inspected approximately 4500 parcels. This year the appraisal work was done in the townships of Dexter, Sargeant, Lyle and Nevada and in the cities of Mapleview, Brownsdale and portions of Austin. Appraisers are also verifying recent sales data for calculating median ratios in

property classifications. New construction is inspected and if a property is still under construction, it will be inspected again prior to year-end as a partially constructed valuation as of January 2 for 2024 values for taxes payable 2025. So far this year there have been 282 sales which is down from approximately 400 last year. There are some large construction projects occurring in the county of note: 1st & 3rd Apartments, Hormel daycare facility and a new Harty Mechanical facility. The University of Minnesota Extension FAARM project is progressing with land acquisition primarily in the area of Udolpho Township.

HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES BOARD:

Austin Aspires Director Jayne Gibson provided the Board with an overview of program. Austin Aspires is a product of Vision 2020 which focuses on educational excellence from cradle to career that is embraced in every aspect of the community influencing policy, practice and procedures. Future outreach will include the broader community of Mower County. Austin Aspires strives to remove obstacles to education such as food and housing insecurity by developing connections that provide "Bridges to Benefits."

Commissioner Reinartz returned at 9:27 a.m.

Austin Aspires is building relationships with day care providers assisting with connections for training and licensure. It is working to build relationships to enhance county-wide affordable internet connectivity. And, Austin Aspires is partnering with Riverland, Gerard and the United Way for a pilot youth mentoring program involving 5th graders at I.J. Holton.

**ORDINANCE
Zoning Ordinance**

On motion of Commissioner Reinartz, seconded by Commissioner Sparks, the following Ordinance was unanimously passed and adopted by the Mower County Board of Commissioners at a meeting held September 12, 2023 at the Mower County Government Center, Austin, Minnesota.

WHEREAS, a Notice of Intention to hold a public hearing to consider amending Sections of the Mower County Zoning Ordinance was published in Mower County's official newspaper, the Austin Daily Herald, on August 12, 2023 and in the Mower County Independent on August 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, notices were made by first class mail to affected parcels and Townships on August 22, 2023. An official list is kept on file in the office of the Environmental Services. Notice was sent to City and Township Clerks on August 28, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Notice having been duly given the Planning Commission held a public hearing on said amendment on September 5, 2023 at 5:30 p.m. in the Mower County Government Center, Board Room, before the Mower County Planning Commission at which any concerned citizen was given an opportunity to speak on the matter; and

WHEREAS, the Mower County Planning Commission recommended by a majority vote to revise sections of the Mower County Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Notice having been duly given, a public hearing was held on September 12, 2023 before the Mower County Board of Commissioners, on said petition; and

BE IT ORDAINED that revisions incorporating all previously approved amendments, and including minor corrections, of the Mower County Zoning Ordinance effective 1/1/2003, amended henceforth shall be incorporated and adopted in their entirety; and

BE IT ORDAINED that the following proposed revisions to Zoning Ordinance Section 14-108; shall be incorporated and adopted in its entirety;

SECTION 14-108. ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICIAL ZONING MAP

Incorporation by Reference: The Official Zoning Map together with all materials attached thereto is hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of this ordinance. The attached material includes the Flood Insurance Study Mower County, Minnesota and Incorporated Areas; Flood Insurance Rate Map Index Mower County, Minnesota and Incorporated Areas with map number 27099CINDOA; and all Flood Insurance Rate Map panels on the Flood Insurance Rate Map Index that apply to the unincorporated areas of Mower County, Minnesota; all of the aforementioned documents being dated September 4, 2013 and prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. *The county also adopts by reference the following Letter of Map Revisions:*

- *Case No. 16-05-4681P, dated February 22, 2017*
- *Case No. 21-05-3696P, dated September 15, 2023*

The Official Zoning Map shall be on file in the Office of the County Zoning Administrator.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that Ordinance #02-23 shall be effective upon publication in the Legal Newspaper of Mower County, the "Austin Daily Herald." (*published 9/16/23*)

A copy of the entire Mower County Zoning Ordinance and related maps, if any, are on file in the Mower County Public Works Office and at the County Auditor-Treasurer office.

1. One-time Retention Bonus: a non-precedent setting bonus of \$5,000 for all non-probationary employees in recognition of their continued service to Mower County;
2. Hiring Bonus: a \$5,000 bonus for all new correctional officers hired on or after January 1, 2023 paid in quarterly increments; and
3. Recruitment Bonus: a \$3,000 recruitment bonus to any active employee who refers a successful correctional officer applicant to be paid in quarterly increments with the new hire's continued success.

This recruitment and retention plan shall periodically reviewed for continuation. Motion carried.

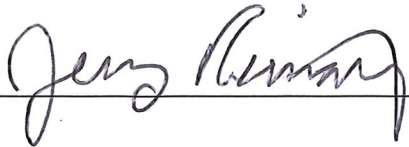

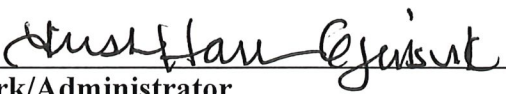
Commissioner Ankeny reported he had attended the Finance meeting on 9/7/23 and attended the mural dedication at the Austin Municipal pool on 9/8/23.
